

## 10 Tips For Improved Communications



# Keep Communication Regular and Predictable

- Members want to know when to expect their newsletter
- Regular outreaches on social also keep members engaged and informed



### Make It Member-Centric


- Spotlight member stories
- Highlight local activities
- Celebrate milestones

The more you illustrate the individuals and connections, the more people will engage.





## **Keep It Short and Visual**



- Attention spans are short and getting shorter.
- Use headlines, bullet points, and photos to break up text.
- Add captions to photos to provide context and personality.
- Direct your readers to where they can learn more.



### **Know Your Audience**

- Sometimes what you like or find interesting doesn't align with your membership.
- Ensure you are providing content for your membership segments.
- Look at how you can make national news/issues more local.





## Remain Nonpartisan



- This does not mean you can't discuss political topics, but it does mean you need to be careful.
- Utilize MOAA's advocacy content and language.



## **Use Multiple Channels**

- Not all members or prospects what to engage or learn in the same way.
- Use the channels that resonate with your members and prospects.
- Options include email, print, website, in-person meetings, and social media.





## **Share Your Local Impact**




- Share how your chapter is making a difference — in the community, in advocacy, or for members themselves.
- Share these stories with national MOAA so we can help amplify what you are doing.




## **Keep in Updated**

### Follow the Comms Awards Criteria




 The criteria for the Comms Awards hits on a lot of key elements.



## Review, Measure, and Improve

- Track what works: Are members opening your emails, following you on social, attending your events?
- Use that data to adjust your approach and continuously improve communication effectiveness.

- Did you get it from a source for which you have a license?
- Did you hire the writer or photographer?
- Did you find it on the internet?
- Is it a seal?
- Did you use it from MOAA?

- Did you attribute it?Did you link to it?
- Did you rewrite someone else's article?






