Why Advocacy?

- Given the fierce competition for limited funding, strong advocacy on the Hill is essential to ensure that service-earned pay and benefits are not compromised in the name of cost savings.
- Each of us must be engaged active duty, retired, veterans & military spouses
 to encourage future generations to serve and to champion the needs of the uniformed services and veteran communities.
- Continue to educate & inform elected officials:
 - 93 veterans serving today in Congress 17%
 - 129 in 2007 24%
 - 389 in 1969 73%

118th Congress - Legislative Highlights

Currently Serving:

Targeted pay table reforms for junior enlisted members (E-1 to E-4).

Retirees/Veterans:

- MOAA-DAV Ending the Wait Report.
- Restoration of caisson services at Arlington National Cemetery.

Family/Survivors:

- Portability of professional licenses to support military spouse employment.
- Extension for minor dependents to file death gratuity claims.

DoD Health Care:

 The MOAA-backed REWARD Experience Act waives obstructive regulations and enable MTFs to retain talented medical personnel so that they remain part of the DoD health care system.

VA Health Care:

 The Elizabeth Dole Act provides significant relief to veterans and their families by expanding benefits, enhancing services, and improving long-term care solutions.

119th Congress - Enduring and Redline Issues

Enduring Issues:

 Issues that we will always advocate for, until passed, even if they are not among our day-to-day priorities, such as concurrent receipt for combat wounded (Richard Star Act), Arlington National Cemetery access, or COLA.

Redline Issues:

- Issues that we continually monitor and will immediately mobilize the entire association, our membership, the MSO/VSO community, and our allies to protect, such as:
 - Decrements to scheduled pay increases as defined by law.
 - Any new TRICARE or TRICARE Pharmacy Program fee.
 - TRICARE cost sharing increases that exceed military retired pay COLA or TRICARE Pharmacy Program cost sharing that exceeds common industry practice.
 - Unequal decrements of compensation and benefits based on rank, age, family composition, retirement status, or disability benefits.
